



# ANCIENT MARINER'S FAMILY BOATBUILDING EVENT

Congratulations to the Following Families that participated in the Family Boatbuilding Event on June 16-18, 2000 at the Ancient Mariners Sailing Society (AMSS)'s Wooden Boat Festival at Koehler Kraft Boatyard on Shelter Island, San Diego!

The Five Families were chosen out of eight applicants this year to receive full scholarships (valued at \$825) to participate in the Ancient Mariners' Sailing Society (AMSS)Family Boat Building Event that was held June 16, 17 and 18, 2000 during the Wooden Boat Festival at Koehler Kraft Boatyard on Shelter Island, San Diego. The 12-foot wooden Bevins Skiff designed by Joe Youcha (Alexandria Seaport) became the property of the Families after the completion of the Event! We do have a requirement that the Families write about the experience, and that they will send us photographs of their finished boat (the boats leave the event unpainted and un-primed).

The Plan Builders, the family helpers, were Doug Jones, AMSS Commodore, as Lead Carpenter, Jeff Demeester helped by bringing a finished Bevin's Skiff from Ramona Wilderness Workshop (RAWW) and helped with the preliminaries, Sue Ellen Dolan from Oaks Park in Portland, Oregon (near the Willamette River-who is having a FBB Event on July 7-9), Tom Jackson from Jackson Engineering also helped with the preliminaries, and myself. Steve Hernadez who worked at Alexandria Seaport with previous FBB Events and now is a Marine stationed in San Diego, came by and gave his approval.

The contributors of the kits were: two kits from the San Diego Maritime Museum's Committee for a Traditional Small Boat Center at NTC, one from the Ancient Mariners' Sailing Society (in the name of Douglas K. Smith), one from Jack Sutphen in the name of Scouting, and one from Beth Chavet in the name of Douglas K. Smith. We thank WoodenBoat Magazine for suppling the sun shade for the event. Downwind Marine contributed painters for all the skiffs and a set of oars. West Marine also contributed a set of oars. Bill Clark of Clark Custom Boats has allowed the use of his yard for cutting up the up the rails, chines, seat risers, and keels as well as storage of materials and kits. Koehler for allowing us to do this event at Koehler Kraft Boatyard and the Ancient Mariners, WoodenBoat Magazine, and the Log for advertizing the event.

The Families began at Koehler Kraft Boatyard at 14:00 Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup>. We work from 8:00 to 18:00 on Saturday and started at 8:00 Sunday with formal launchings of each skiff that Sunday afternoon at 15:30. The event was structured after several events sponsored by WoodenBoat Magazine where as many as 60 families participated.

At the **NOVEMBER MEETING** we will show videos from Channel 51 and 8 plus a time lapsed video prepared by the Merbeck family of the event. Also the families will hopefully be at the meeting to update us on the status of the Skiffs and their experiences with them. The Skiffs qualify for Ancient Mariner Flag membership and hopefully we will have a new class (short course) for the Yesteryear Regatta. Thanks to everyone who lent a hand!!!! 
